

Visitation Rules and Guidelines

All visitors are responsible to know the rules in their entirety. Anyone found to be non-compliant risks losing visitation privileges permanently.

- All video visitation sessions are subject to monitoring and recording.
- Visitors and Inmates are required to face the camera at all times.
- All video visitation sessions must be scheduled 24 hours prior to the appointment or up to 7 days in advance.
- The length of each video visitation session, remote and onsite, is 20 minutes.
- Remote video visitation sessions are limited based on inmate location.
- If a visitor does not show up for a scheduled visitation session, a refund will not be issued.
- If internet connection is lost during the visitation session, the visitor will not be allowed to reconnect and a refund will not be issued.
- If an inmate is in any program or unavailable for any reason (court, trustee assignments, attorney visits, etc.), they are NOT eligible to receive the video visitation session at that time. Video visitation sessions must be scheduled around inmate programs, assignments, etc.
- All visitors must present valid identification which must include one of the following:
 1. Driver's License (current or expired);
 2. Any picture ID issued by a City, County, State or Government Agency.
- All visitors must be on the inmate's approved visitor list to conduct a video visitation session.
- All visitors are expected to be fully dressed in appropriate clothing. The following types of clothing are **prohibited**:
 1. Clothing made of sheer transparent, net or mesh materials;
 2. Clothing that exposes the stomach, back, shoulders, chest, midriff or underarms;
 3. Clothing designed or intended to be worn tightly to accent the body such as spandex leggings, tank tops, bodysuits, etc.;
 4. Skirts, jumpers, dresses or culottes no more than four (4) inches above the knee;
 5. Shorts – except for minor children;
 6. Hats or head gear-except religiously recognized and approved;
 7. Clothing with gang, obscene or distracting messages, shapes or designs;
 8. Clothing resembling security uniforms or inmate clothing.
- Any inappropriate activity will result in termination of the video visitation session.
- Visitors involved in the following will be placed on permanent visiting restrictions:
 1. Visitors that create a disturbance or disruption of the visiting process.
 2. Visitors that refuse to show sufficient identification.
 3. Visitors under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- The visitation schedule may be cancelled or altered on the facility's appointed holidays or for safety/security reasons.
- Staff can deny, change or cancel a video visitation session at any time at their discretion.
- After the video visitation session has ended, the connection will be terminated.
